At the end of every grant year, BISD will host a full day Conference for 200 K-5 teachers from 34 High Needs Elementary schools in Year 1. The conference titled, 'Post-Pandemic Literacy: Teaching Students with Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and Learning Loss' will positively impact 90% of the participants using a survey and evaluation scale. Teachers will experience new strategies to help the Covid Learning Slide and foster healthy ways to implement remote learning strategies for the home and school environment. A futuristic Literacy World will allow teachers face to face presentations, global remote learning experiences, hands on workshops with modern technology for literacy improvements that focus on knowledge-building curriculum aligned to state standards.

BISD Grants department utilizing Edwin Barrera, BISD Grant Specialist, with 30 years of grant experience evaluating and implementing both federal and state grants, will ensure that evaluation data will be used to determine when to modify the project plan, including, if quarterly progress or summative SMART goals do not show progress. The proposal also includes but is not limited to consistent, collection of data that measures progress to stated benchmark goals and process of data analysis and related programmatic adjustments. 2021-2022 Texas Reading Initiative - Literacy Coaching and Professional Development Grades K-5 data will be aligned to benchmarks and metrics in prior section. In order to ensure project's success, careful monitoring will be in place to evaluate and ensure participants are meeting benchmark goals. The goal of BISD is to improve long term literacy. The current percent of AA degrees of HS BISD graduates is 0% compared to the Region at 5% and to the state standard of 2% for all of the seven BISD High Schools (2019-20 TAPR).

PROGRAM MODIFICATION- The grant will meet with stakeholders to discuss existing barriers and meet with teachers, as needed, and/or district administrator to discuss barriers a student is experiencing and develop an action plan. Participants not meeting the intervention standards will receive additional support and development opportunities in the areas of need, informal or format intervention plan, and/or additional opportunities for continued professional development.

PROGRAM FEEDBACK-A survey will be administered to students, teachers, literacy coaches, and district contacts every 6 months. All stakeholders will provide feedback regarding the experience with the program, provide information regarding additional assistance/support needed in order for the students to succeed and have the opportunity to provide feedback on how to improve the services. Careful analysis of data provided through these surveys will be conducted. Additional support and training will be provided through round-table meetings and/or professional development. The BISD Leadership Design Team (LDT) will meet monthly to ensure the Reading Conference Framework is being developed on schedule.
