Rosebud-Lott's primary goal is to offer a Summer CTE Internship Program for students in our welding program of study. Students will be interns for the school district and be responsible for completing various summer projects for the school district and surrounding organizations. This will allow students to apply academic and classroom knowledge while gaining real world experience. We aim to provide our welding students with authentic learning experiences to help them develop and hone their welding skills during the summer months. We aim to partner with actual organizations such as the City of Rosebud and the Marlin Animal Shelter to allow our students to complete projects of value for our community. Our welding students are capable of mending animal cages in need of repair, fixing handrails for the city, and building items of need such as benches or trash cans.

By August 2023, 12 students (100%) will have fulfilled their internship responsibilities. All students (100%) will have actively contributed to the internship project, as measured by internship supervisor feedback (internship supervisors will be district employees) and Internship Training Plan completion.

A secondary goal is to support our new P-TECH which just launched in 2022. One of the P-TECH pathways available to students is welding. We aim to provide authentic work-based learning opportunities to our P-TECH students. This summer program is just one additional way for our students to gain hands-on experience.

We will meet these goals and objectives by equipping our leadership to support the summer program, ensuring that staff are able to promote the opportunity to students who will benefit from the experience, and beginning the recruitment process once grantees are announced. We will support the teachers/internship leads by providing necessary instructional materials and instructional support.

Payroll (6100): \$5,000 has been budgeted to pay extra duty pay to two teachers who will supervise and instruct interns over the summer grant period. \$2,200 has been budgeted to pay for two bus drivers to run routes to pick up students and take them home at the end of the day. Funds have also been allocated for employee benefits contributions.

Professional & Contracted Services (6200): \$14,400 has been allocated for student/intern stipends for their work during the summer program. For budgeting purposes, we are planning on paying interns \$60 per day for 20 days of work at 4 hours per day. Funds have also been allocated to pay a provider to assist the district with data collection, analysis, and reporting associated with the program.

Supplies and Materials (6300): Approx. \$17,000 has been budgeted to buy consumable welding materials and supplies which will be used by the interns to complete summer projects.

Other Operating Costs (6400): \$2,500 has been budgeted for transportation (likely a small bus). \$2,500 has been budgeted for other operating costs which may arise during the summer program.

Capital Outlay (6600): \$0 has been allocated for capital outlay. The district has welding equipment already.

As a member of the Texas Regional Pathways Network, we value work-based learning and desire for our students to have the opportunity for paid learning experiences when possible. Therefore, we plan to pay students (via stipends) through this internship program to enroll those students who otherwise would not be able to afford forgoing summer employment elsewhere. Without this grant, we may not be able to provide this summer program. Courses in Welding are offered during the school year at no cost to students but are not currently offered during the summer. We hope that, through this opportunity, we will provide data showing return on investment for future internship funding possibilities from our community and school board. We believe this program will help to serve students receiving special education services and also support engaging female students in welding.

Rosebud-Lott ISD is a rural school district and many businesses are located in cities 20-30 miles away such as Waco and Temple. Offering work-based learning experiences during the school year is a challenge due to master schedule constraints, travel time, and distance to learning sites. Offering summer work-based learning opportunities provides greater flexibility for our students and our staff. With students working most of the day, they will have adequate time to really focus on their projects which may not happen during the traditional school year.

Workforce Solutions for the Heart of Texas' Targeted Occupations List includes Welders, Cutters, Solderers, and Brazers (51-4121). Our proposed summer program is aligned with regional labor market demand and leads to living wage jobs with strong career pathway growth.

Rosebud-Lott ISD will serve as the host/provider for the internships and will be the employer of record. The internship will require approx. 80 hours of work/commitment from our students. We will serve 12 students through this program. The internship will allow students to work independently and in teams to repair objects for local organizations and/or build new items such as benches and metal trash cans for the community. In addition to improving their welding skills, students will learn communication, collaboration, problem solving skills and teamwork during this program.

The Summer CTE Internship Program will be available to a total of 12 students (ideally students in grades 11-12). P-TECH welding students may be prime candidates for the internships due to their advanced skill set. Our leadership team will collaborate with one another to promote this opportunity to students from both P-TECH and non-P-TECH programs.

We will collaborate with the City of Rosebud and the Marlin Animal Shelter to provide authentic learning experiences to our students. The City of Rosebud needs handrails repaired throughout the city and the Marlin Animal Shelter needs animal cages and enclosures repaired. Our welding students are capable of performing the needed repairs. It is a win-win situation for our students and the local organizations. Students will also build items for the school district itself such as benches and metal trash cans.
