gauge where we are at each checkpoint and make any adjustments as needed. We will utilize our district staff to assist with implementation and support the campus leaders as needed.

We will have check in meetings with the campus leadership teams periodically to ensure we are still on target for plans. During our leadership meetings we will discuss how we can target PLCs and develop a campus plan for each campus. While we are implementing the grant, we will utilize the district staff to assist the campuses with implementation. If any barriers and challenges arise, we will utilize our ESC regional center for guidance and implement the actions swiftly.
