

## Track engagement and manage attendance during remote instruction.

With the Schoology learning management system (LMS), districts can collect data to meet attendance requirements\* and monitor student engagement.

Whether providing synchronous or asynchronous instruction, teachers can gather engagement data through video conferences, digital discussions, collaborative group interactions, embedded tools, and more.



### Support for Synchronous Attendance

During **remote synchronous** learning—when a teacher provides two-way, real-time instruction—students must complete a daily minimum number of instructional minutes. Schoology enables teachers to:

- Take attendance directly in the LMS during synchronous virtual instruction
- Create comments in the attendance section
- Run attendance reports

### Asynchronous Engagement Tracking

Schoology provides tools for monitoring and documenting student engagement during **remote asynchronous** learning, when students may be completing lessons and activities on their own.

After submitting a learning plan to TEA for approval, districts providing remote asynchronous instruction must track daily student progress in the LMS, via teacher-student interactions, or based on assignments the student completes/turns to the teacher.

Schoology enables teachers to:

- Track student engagement at the individual, course, school, and district levels
- Monitor progress on pre-assigned work
- View a time stamp to see when student work was submitted
