QISD will leverage existing relationships to recruit paraprofessionals and non-certified staff to transition to certified teaching roles. QISD will use funds to incentive and support staff to obtain a bachelors degree and teaching certification and remain in QISD as a classroom teacher. Pathway 2 addresses efforts to transition paraprofessionals, instructional aides, and long-term substitute teachers to full-time, certified teacher roles. This is done through funding and support of their bachelor's degree and teacher certification programs. The approach is intended to promote better long-term recruitment and retention by targeting already proven and dedicated staff who desire opportunities for advancement. This approach also intends to facilitate increased entry of diverse candidates into the teaching profession.

QISD is seeking funding for 4 paraprofessionals, instructional aides, or longterm subs to obtain a Bachelors Degree and Teacher Certification in the amount of \$76,000.00. Candidate stipends will cover tuition, fees, and living expenses incurred within the timeline grant.

QISD will use an applicant application for pathway 2 candidates. Individual candidate reference surveys will be sent to campus principals to help determine the likelihood the candidate will complete the required steps. The candidates will be required to write a letter and provide three letters of reference to determine the candidate's commitment to teach long term. The candidates will receive a rubric rating based on four criteria: Application received on time, Current GPA, Projected Graduation Date, and Recommendations. Since the representative demographics of the teachers closely mirrors that of the students, consideration and priority will be given to candidates who are accustomed to rural lifestyles, have community ties, and are seeking certification in hard to fill content area indicated in the needs assessment.
