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Summary of Program

1. Describe how the LEA will support campus(es) in carrying out school support and improvement activities, including how the LEA will develop a web-based improvement plan for the eligible campuses selected for this grant.

Aspermont ISD will continue to support the Elementary Comprehensive Support Campus in school improvement as we have the past two years.

Aspermont ISD will partner with ESC 14 Texas Instructional Leadership in order to continue efforts in growing effective leaders and teachers to improve student outcomes and diminish the educational gaps.

District Coordinator of School Improvement Zacharia Morris, along with Elementary Principal Trent Van Meter will participate in training with Texas Instructional Leadership for the length of the grant window (2021-2022, 2022-2023). They will begin with training in the 2021 summer with Action Coaching and Lesson Alignment/ Formative Assessment. The DCSI will also serve as the principal supervisor for TIL. AISD will conduct biweekly meetings with campus administration to provide open communication and support. DCSI, as well as Campus Principal will commit to attend regularly scheduled ESF, TIL, Web-based TIP, and other School Improvement Trainings at Region 14. DCSI will work with the Campus Leadership Team to develop the web-based improvement plan.

Aspermont Elementary will continue to contract with Region 14 for School Improvement Support efforts as well as Curriculum Support.

2. Describe how the LEA will monitor schools receiving the ESF-Focused Support Grant, including how the LEA will: (a) Monitor a web-based improvement plans upon submission and during implementation, and (b) Implement additional action following unsuccessful implementation of such plan after the first year of the grant cycle.

Kristin Marsh will be the campus contact for our ESF-Focused Support Grant, and will be responsible for entering into the online system. The plan will be monitored through regularly scheduled biweekly meetings. The Campus Leadership Team including Campus Principal, School Counselor, and DCSI will all work together in assuring the plan is implemented with fidelity. The DCSI will assure that the web-based plan, interventions and submissions are completed in a timely manner. The campus will continue benchmark testing and data collection through multiple programs as well as meeting with the TIL coach monthly to track progress. Campus Leadership team, along with DCSI will have scheduled dates after completion of first year to evaluate data and progress for moving forward into year 2 of implementing the plan. Dates will be scheduled in August of 2021 for professional development with all district staff so that plan will be implemented across the entire district for uniformity of expectations.

Aspermont ISD will continue to partner with campus administration to make sure campus needs are met, to fully support all staff, to set campus budgets, and to hire and assign staff where needed. The district will ensure access to high quality formative assessment resources aligned to state standards through the use of programs such as DMAC and MAP. The district has effective RTI systems to identify and support struggling learners. The district will also provide teachers the tools, the support, and the coaching they need to implement data driven instruction practices. Aspermont ISD will allocate funds to be spent as campus leadership sees fit.

Aspermont ISD will allocate 6300 funds for instructional materials to differentiate learning for students such as MAP, Lexical Alexs, and DMAC. Fund 6200 will be set to include the cost of the Texas Instructional Leadership. The district and campus Principal will look to hire an interventionist to assist in student learning and remediation, up to 60 % of grant funds will be allocated to 6100.	;

Title IV will continue to provide technology resources for campus use.
