

# **Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools 2000-01**

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# Introduction

The listings in this report provide secondary school completion and dropout data at the county level as a supplement to *Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools, 2000-01* (Texas Education Agency (TEA), 2002a), *Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools, 2000-01: Supplemental District Data* (TEA, 2002c), and *Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools, 2000-01: District and Campus Listings* (TEA, 2002b). This supplement includes annual dropout rates and longitudinal rates for secondary school graduates, General Educational Development (GED) recipients, continuing students, and dropouts. County listings of 2000-01 annual dropout rates and completion/student status rates for the class of 2001 are presented. A schematic is provided illustrating the relationship, at the district or campus level, of annual and longitudinal dropout counts.



## Calculations

All data used in this report were collected and reported by Texas school districts and charter schools through the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) maintained by the Texas Education Agency (TEA). The rate calculations are the same as those used in the Academic Excellence Indicator System (AEIS).

In this report, the annual dropout rate is the percentage of students who dropped out of Grades 7-12 during the 2000-01 school year:

$$\text{annual dropout rate} = \frac{\text{number of dropouts during the school year}}{\text{total number of students served during the school year}} \times 100$$

Dropouts are defined and counted as per *2000-2001 Public Education Information Management System Data Standards* (TEA, 2000), the *2001-2002 Public Education Information Management System Data Standards* (TEA, 2001), the *2002 Accountability Manual* (TEA, 2002d), and *Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools, 2000-01* (TEA, 2002a). The total number of students in the denominator is the cumulative number of students in attendance in the county at any time during the school year. The 2000-01 annual dropout rate is a base indicator in the 2002 campus and district ratings.

In 1998-99, TEA introduced a new set of longitudinal rates. These rates show the high school outcomes for the members of a Grade 9 cohort of students. Students who transferred out are removed from the cohort. Students who transferred in on grade-level are added to the cohort. The final status of each student is determined the year graduation was expected, or four years after entering Grade 9. The final four outcomes included are: graduated, received a GED certificate, continued high school, or dropped out. As an example, the longitudinal rate for graduates is calculated by dividing the number of students who graduated by the number of students in the cohort:

$$\text{longitudinal rate, graduated} = \frac{\text{number of students graduating by year 4}}{(\text{number of students entering Grade 9}) - (\text{transfers out}) + (\text{transfers in})} \times 100$$

Longitudinal rates for GED recipients, students who continued high school, and dropouts are calculated in a similar manner. The sum of the four rates is equal to 100 percent. The class of 2001 longitudinal rates are report-only indicators in the 2002 accountability system.

## Notes on Tables 1 and 2

### **Cohort**

TEA longitudinal secondary school student status rates are based on a Grade 7 or Grade 9 cohort. A 1997-98 Grade 9 cohort, for example, consists of all students who attended Grade 9 in a Texas public school for the first time during the 1997-98 school year. The cohort is named based on the expected year of graduation. In our example, this is the class of 2001. Each member of the cohort is tracked through the fall of 2001, and a final status is assigned. Students who transfer out are removed from the cohort. Students who transfer in on grade-level—for example, into Grade 10 in 1998-99—are added to the cohort. The final status assigned may be: graduate, General Educational Development (GED) recipient, continuing, or dropout. Students with any other final statuses, or without final statuses, are removed from the cohort.

### **Continuing Student**

A continuing student is one who was enrolled in a Texas public school in the fall of the school year following expected graduation.

### **Dropout**

Dropouts are defined and counted as per *2000-2001 Public Education Information Management System Data Standards* (TEA, 2000), the *2001-2002 Public Education Information Management System Data Standards* (TEA, 2001), the *2002 Accountability Manual* (TEA, 2002d), and *Secondary School Completion and Dropouts in Texas Public Schools, 2000-01* (TEA, 2002a). A student who dropped out but later returned or received a diploma or GED certificate is counted based on his or her final status, not as a dropout.

### **Economically Disadvantaged**

The number of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch or eligible for other public assistance as defined in the *2001-2002 Public Education Information Management System Data Standards* (TEA, 2001) is used as a proxy for the number of economically disadvantaged students. Eligibility for free or reduced price lunch or other public assistance is reported for each student at the time of enrollment.

### **Ethnicity/race**

Ethnicity/race is one of the demographic characteristics reported for each student at the time of enrollment.

### **GED recipient**

A GED recipient is a student awarded a GED certificate.

### **Graduate**

A graduate is a student awarded a high school diploma by a Texas public school.

### **Total Students**

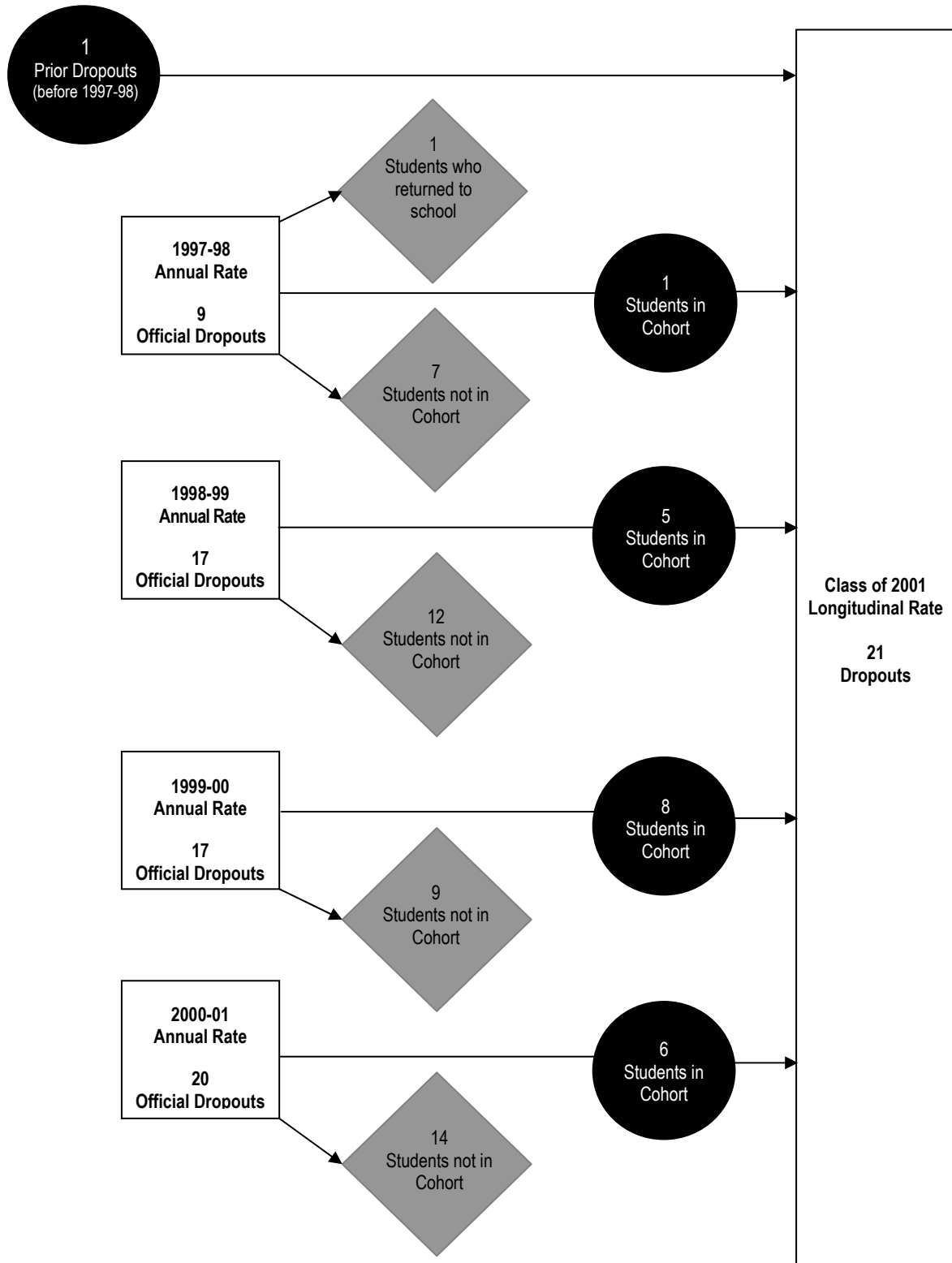
Total students reported is a cumulative total of students served at the campus, or in the district, county, or state, during the school year.

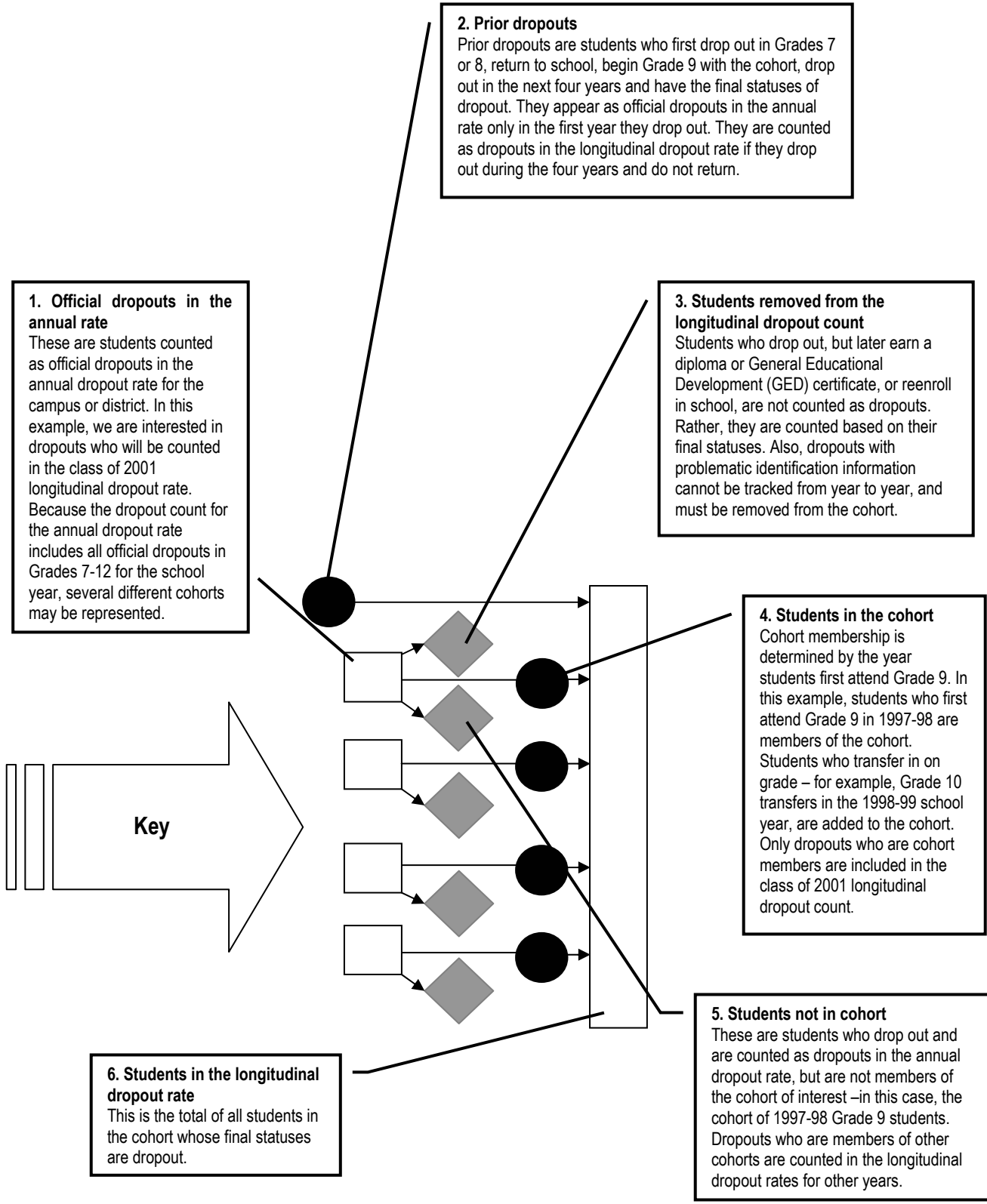

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Reviews of local education agencies pertaining to compliance with Title VI Civil Rights Act of 1964 and with specific requirements of the Modified Court Order, Civil Action No. 5281, Federal District Court, Eastern District of Texas, Tyler Division are conducted periodically by staff representatives of the Texas Education Agency. These reviews cover at least the following policies and practices:

1. acceptance policies on student transfers from other school districts;
2. operation of school bus routes or runs on a nonsegregated basis;
3. nondiscrimination in extracurricular activities and the use of school facilities;
4. nondiscriminatory practices in the hiring, assigning, promoting, paying, demoting, reassigning, or dismissing of faculty and staff members who work with children;
5. enrollment and assignment of students without discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin;
6. nondiscriminatory practices relating to the use of a student's first language; and
7. evidence of published procedures for hearing complaints and grievances.

In addition to conducting reviews, the Texas Education Agency staff representatives check complaints of discrimination made by a citizen or citizens residing in a school district where it is alleged discriminatory practices have occurred or are occurring.

Where a violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act is found, the findings are reported to the Office for Civil Rights, U.S. Department of Education.

If there is a direct violation of the Court Order in Civil Action No. 5281 that cannot be cleared through negotiation, the sanctions required by the Court Order are applied.

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
