## **Funding Formulas**

#### Title I. Part A

Program Statute Requirements for Allocating Title I, Part A Funds to Local Education Agencies:

#### **Census Updates**

The U. S. Department of Education (USDE) allocates, through the state education agency, Title I, Part A funds by LEA using the <u>Census Bureau's 2010 school district estimates of poor school-age children</u> (NOT free and reduced price lunch) and the annual update of neglected and foster home children.

#### **Hold-Harmless Amounts**

As required by Public Law 107-110, Section 1122(c), the USDE will allocate basic, concentration, targeted, and Education Finance Incentive Grant (EFIG) funds using a variable hold harmless based on the percent the LEA's formula children are of the LEA's 5-17 population as reflected below:

95% of prior-year entitlement if formula children are 30% or greater;

90% of prior-year entitlement if formula children are 15% and less than 30%;

85% of prior-year entitlement if formula children are less than 15%.

#### **Basic Grant**

- 1. Children to be Counted (ages 5-17, inclusive) An LEA's Basic Grant shall be based on the number of **formula** children residing within the LEA boundaries. Formula children are defined as:
  - a. low-income children as documented by the Census Bureau's poverty criteria (not free/reduced-price lunch criteria);
  - b. children who live in foster homes as reported by the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services; and
  - c. children who live in facilities for neglected children as reported on the Annual Survey of Children in Local Facilities for Neglected Children (SC9000 through eGrants).
- 2. LEA Eligibility in order to be eligible for Title I, Part A Basic Grant funds, an LEA must have:
  - a. at least ten formula children; and
  - b. the number of formula children must be greater than two percent of the LEA's population (ages 5-17, inclusive, as documented by the Census Bureau's poverty criteria).

#### **Concentration Grant**

- 1. Children to be Counted same **formula** children as required for a Basic Grant.
- 2. LEA Eligibility in order to be eligible for Title I, Part A Concentration Grant funds, an LEA must:
  - a. be eligible for a Basic Grant; and
  - b. have total formula children that exceed 6,500 or the number must exceed 15 percent of the total population in the LEA (ages 5-17, inclusive).

Exception: An LEA that does not meet the minimum eligibility criteria for a Concentration Grant for four consecutive years shall no longer be eligible to receive a hold-harmless amount for a Concentration Grant.

#### **Targeted Grant**

- 1. Children to be Counted same **formula** children as required for a Basic Grant.
- 2. LEA Eligibility in order to be eligible for Title I, Part A Targeted Grant funds, an LEA must have:
  - a. at least ten formula children; and
  - b. the number of formula children must be five percent or greater of the LEA's population (ages 5-17, inclusive, as documented by the Census Bureau's poverty criteria).

#### **Education Finance Incentive Grant (EFIG)**

- 1. Children to be Counted same **formula** children as required for a Basic Grant.
- 2. LEA Eligibility in order to be eligible for Title I, Part A EFIG Grant funds, an LEA must have:
  - a. at least ten formula children; and
  - b. the number of formula children must be five percent or greater of the LEA's population (ages 5-17, inclusive, as documented by the Census Bureau's poverty criteria).

#### Title I, Part A-Eligibility and Allocation to Charter Schools

Charter schools (LEAs) must be determined eligible for Title I, Part A basic, concentration, targeted, and incentive grants based upon the same eligibility requirements of **resident** LEAs. See detailed eligibility requirements on the previous two pages. Charter schools are public schools but not school districts; therefore, they do not have established census LEA boundaries. A charter school's eligibility and entitlement (*if eligible*) are determined based on **actual** enrollment data submitted by the charter school on eGrants form SC5010—NCLB Data Request Form for Federal Funding for school year 2012-2013. Enrollment data reported on this form are used to prorate the number of census low-income students from the **resident** LEA to the charter school. **Steps 1** through **3** below determine the charter school's **eligibility** for a Title I, Part A grant. **Steps 4 through 6** on the following page reflect calculation of entitlement.

#### Title I, Part C—Education of Migratory Children (including charter schools)

Allocation of Funds to Local Education Agencies

Of the total funds available for planning amounts for local education agencies:

- 40 percent is allocated for the Priority for Services category:
- 55 percent is allocated for the Number and Needs category;
- 5 percent is allocated for the Other Sources of Funds category, which includes Title I, Part A, Title III, Part A, and State Compensatory Education.

#### LEA Eligibility

A local education agency with identified Migrant students in the New Generation System (NGS) may apply for funds under the Title I, Part C—Migrant Education Program.

Local education agencies wanting more information regarding Migrant student eligibility should contact their regional education service center (ESC).

# Title I, Part D, Subpart 2—Prevention and Intervention Programs for Children and Youth Who Are Neglected, Delinquent or At-Risk (including charter schools)

LEA Eligibility—in order to be eligible for Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 funds, an LEA must have at least ten children aged 5-17, inclusive, reported as residing in facilities for delinquent youth through the Survey of Children in Local Facilities for Neglected and/or Delinquent Children (SC9000 through eGrants).

The Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 entitlement is based on a formula per-pupil amount. The total statewide number of delinquent youth aged 5 though 17, inclusive, reported through the Survey of Children in Local Facilities for Neglected and/or Delinquent Children (SC9000) is divided into the available Part D, Subpart 2 funds to establish a per-pupil amount. An LEA's entitlement is calculated by multiplying its number of reported delinquent youth by the per-pupil amount. All youth in local correctional facilities or facilities for the delinquent through the age of 21 are eligible to be served.

The LEA administrator certified on the annual survey (SC9000) that a physical verification of the facility's auditable documentation which supports the October 2009 caseload information was conducted. Texas Education Agency monitoring teams and auditors will be verifying the documentation, which supports the number of children residing in the facility during October 2009.

#### Title II, Part A—Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Fund

Allocation of Funds to Local Education Agencies:

Hold-harmless amounts based on entitlements LEAs received in school year 2001-2002 for:

- Title II, Part B-Eisenhower Professional Development Program; and
- Title VI—Class Size Reduction Program

#### Additional Funds Appropriated

- 20 percent based on the LEA's total population [ages 5-17, inclusive, as documented by the Census Bureau's 2008census estimates]; and
- 80 percent based on the LEA's low-income children as documented by the Census Bureau's 2008 census poverty estimates (not free/reduced-price lunch students).

#### Title II, Part A- Eligibility and Allocation to Charter Schools

The charter school enrollment data submitted on eGrants form SC5010—NCLB Data Request Form for Federal Funding" for school year 2012-2013 are used to determine eligibility and entitlement amounts for the 2001-2002 Title II, Part B and Class-Size components of the Title II, Part A formula. Data submitted on the form also provides for the 5-17 enrollment component and determines prorated census low income for the low-income component. **Steps 1** through **5** determine the 2001-2002 Title II, Part B entitlement amount. **Steps 6** and **7** determine the 2001-2002 Class-Size entitlement amount. **Step 8** determines census low-income entitlement and 5-17 enrollment entitlement and sums the charter school's total Title II, Part A entitlement.

- A "significant increase" of immigrant students for an LEA to qualify for immigrant funds is defined as an increase of 50% or more in the number of immigrant students. In addition, the current year count of immigrant students must be 30 or more.

Allocation of **Immigrant Funds** to Local Education Agencies:

- Number of students identified as immigrant in fall 2011, fall 2010 and fall 2009 and reported to PEIMS.
- An average number is obtained from fall 2010 and fall 2009 immigrant data. This average is subtracted from the number of immigrant students reported for fall 2011 and the difference must be a significant increase.
- A 'significant increase' of immigrant students for an LEA to qualify for immigrant funds is defined as at least 100 or more immigrant students.
