If your district's year-round tracks end later than June 24, your district may delay resubmission until 2 weeks after the completion of the latest year-round track or August 26, 2010, whichever comes first. In no case may any resubmission occur after August 26, 2010. Corrections made after August 26, 2010, will be handled by the State Funding Division.
