Dear Parent/Guardian:

As of Friday, February 12, 2010, Blank ISD is near funding capacity for Supplemental Educational Services (SES) provided to eligible students as part of the School Improvement Program (SIP); therefore, Blank ISD will begin applying the eligibility criteria described in the cover letter of our parent notification packet dated February 15, 2010. Priority will be given to low-income students who are lowest-achieving in the subject that caused the campus to be identified as not meeting AYP in the following order by grade 10, 12, 9, 11.

Blank ISD will apply the following criteria in determining which students, who submit enrollment forms during the periods indicated, will be eligible for remaining SES vacancies pending funding availability:

*February 15, 2010 – March 2, 2010* – Priority will go to Blank HS students from low-income families who scored less than 2100 on their previous year's TAKS Math assessment and are not already served. Students in grade 10 will receive first priority followed by 12<sup>th</sup> graders then 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders.

*March 3, 2010 – March 31, 2010* – If funds remain, priority will go to Blank HS students from low-income families who scored less than 2100 on their previous year's TAKS Math assessment and are not already served. Students in grade 10 will receive first priority followed by 12<sup>th</sup> graders then 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders.

*April 1, 2010 - April 26, 2010* – If funds remain, priority will go to Blank HS students from low-income families who scored less than 2100 on their previous year's TAKS Math assessment and are not already served. Students in grade 10 will receive first priority followed by 12<sup>th</sup> graders then 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders.
