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CERTIFICATION REQUIRED

Texas Education Code § 21.003. CERTIFICATION REQUIRED.

(a) A person may not be employed as a <u>teacher</u>, <u>teacher intern or teacher trainee</u>, <u>librarian</u>, <u>educational aide</u>, <u>administrator</u>, <u>educational</u> <u>diagnostician</u>, <u>or counselor</u> by a school district unless the person holds an appropriate certificate or permit issued as provided by Subchapter B.

ASSIGNMENT RULES

- 19 TAC, Chapter 231, Assignment of Public School Personnel was created in 2009, replacing Chapter 230, Subchapter U.
- Chapter 231 includes old and new certificates
- Educators must hold the appropriate certificate unless a permit has been activated

REVISIONS TO ASSIGNMENT RULES

- Assignment rules were last revised 2010 when new CTE Courses were added
- Rules currently being revised October 2012
- New courses and certificates will be added
- Stakeholder input face-to-face meetings and Webinar

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CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE)

CTE certificates are classroom certificates designed for teaching in the CTE assignments, preparing students for specific occupations.

NOTE: There is no single certificate called <u>"Career and Technical Education"</u>

There are two general types of CTE certificates:

- Certificates that <u>require</u> skill, experience, and licensing in specific occupations
- Certificates that <u>do not require</u> skill, experience, and licensing in specific occupations



- > Bachelor's degree from accredited university

- Two years of full-time wage-earning experience in a health care profession <u>utilizing the license</u> listed above.
- Completion of an approved educator preparation program
- Teach in the assignment for one year on an emergency permit or probationary certificate
- Pass the <u>TExES</u> for PPR EC-12 #160 or PPR 8-12 #130 (no longer offered) and Health Science Technology 8-12 #173

MARKETING EDUCATION 8-12

- > Bachelor's degree from an accredited university
- Two years of full-time wage-earning experience in a marketing occupation

(Example: Retail Sales)

- Completion of an approved EPP
- > Teaching experience, student teaching, or internship in the assignment
- Pass the TExES for PPR EC-12 #160 or PPR 8-12 #130 (no longer offered) and Marketing 8-12 #175

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSES AND ASSIGNMENTS

New CTE Assignments – In compliance with HB 3485, the SBOE approved new CTE courses, including courses that would satisfy the <u>fourth year of mathematics or science</u> credit for the recommended or distinguished graduation plans.

New CTE courses were implemented in fall 2010

CTE ASSIGNMENTS

- TEA certification staff and curriculum staff work together with stakeholders to recommend revisions to assignment rules in Chapter 231.
- New CTE courses are organized into 16 clusters.
- Multiple certification options are approved for many assignments.
- Additional requirements such as coursework or professional development may apply.




