

Certified Superintendent Demographics by Preparation Route 2008-2012

This table shows the number and percentage of candidates who received their first standard Superintendent certificate through each preparation route, broken down by gender and by race or ethnicity.

Definition. A standard certificate is a certificate offered since 1998-99 that is renewed every five years.

Results

- In most fiscal years shown, the overall majority of Superintendents were male.
- Superintendents were largely white, with blacks/African Americans and Hispanics/Latinos making up the second largest groups.
- Few Superintendents were Asian, American Indian/Alaska Native, or identified as Other; none were Native Hawaiian.
- For most fiscal years, the university post-baccalaureate route produced many more Hispanic/Latino Superintendents than the alternative route.
- The alternative route tended to produce more white Superintendents, and the out-of-state route, more black/African American Superintendents.
- The number of certified Superintendents declined through fiscal year 2009-10 but increased somewhat in subsequent fiscal years.

* Results for individual routes may not sum to the total for All Routes, because the total is a count rather than a sum. A sum of routes may contain duplication as educators can be prepared through more than one route.

Summary of methodology. Five tables were extracted containing identification numbers, preparation route codes, genders, and races or ethnicities of individuals obtaining their first standard Superintendent certificate for fiscal years 2007-08 through 2011-12. For each year and preparation route, a total of all Superintendents was obtained, together with counts by gender and race or ethnicity. Each count was then taken as a percentage of the corresponding total. The process was repeated to obtain overall results for all routes. Finally, the two sets of results were combined into one table.
