- 6. \_\_ Failure to meet state and Local Education Agency (LEA) criminal history background check/fingerprinting requirements.
- 7. \_\_ Failure to comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and any regulations or policies concerning the protection and use of confidential and student identifying information.

When removed, the Provider is removed for the remainder of the school year. The LEA(s) responsible for students the Provider presently serves will be directed to reassign students to the next provider of choice of the students' parents. Provider may reapply during the next application period.
