Training Module Grade Span Groupings



- Should match the basic organization of schools in the LEA
 - Elementary schools
 - Middle schools
 - High schools
- An overlap in grades campuses must be grouped together
- No overlap in grades campuses may be considered separately



Example – LEA Elementary Schools/Overlap

Grade Span	Grade Span Grouping	
K-3	Elementary	
PK-5	Elementary	
4-5	Elementary	

 Group together as Elementary for comparability testing



Example – LEA Elementary Schools/No Overlap

Grade Span	Grade Span Grouping	
PK-1	Elementary	
2–3	Elementary	
4-5	Elementary	

- No overlap in the grouping; thus, each campus is considered separate
- In this scenario, no comparability testing is required



Example – LEA Middle Schools/Overlap

Grade Span	Grade Span Grouping	
5-7	Middle	
6-8	Middle	
7–8	Middle	
6 th Grade	Middle	

 Group together as Middle Schools for comparability testing



Example – LEA Middle Schools/No Overlap

Grade Span	Grade Span Grouping	
6 th Grade	Middle School	
7-8	Middle School	

- No overlap in the grouping; thus, each campus is considered separate
- In this scenario, no comparability testing is required



Examples – LEA High Schools/Overlap

Grade Span	Grade Span Grouping	
9 th Grade	High School	
9–12	High School	
10-12	High School	

 Group together as High Schools for comparability testing



Example – LEA High Schools/No Overlap

Grade Span	Grade Span Grouping	
9 th Grade	High School	
10-12	High School	

- No overlap in the grouping; thus, campus is considered separate
- In this scenario, no comparability testing is required



- Overlapping Grade Span Groupings
 - Campuses which overlap more than one grouping

Grade Span	Possible Grade Span Grouping	As Determined by LEA
05-12	Elem, Middle, High	High
05-06	Elem, Middle	Elem

 Place in the grouping which most accurately represents the makeup of the campus



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
