Proposed Repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 111, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §§111.11-111.17, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §§111.21-111.24, and Proposed Amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 111, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §111.1, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §111.25 (First Reading and Filing Authorization) (Board agenda page II-1) [Consent agenda item #1]

Shelly Ramos, curriculum division director, explained that with the implementation of new mathematics TEKS for kindergarten-grade 8 in the 2014-2015 school year, the older TEKS had been superseded. As a result, it is necessary to repeal the outdated mathematics TEKS for kindergarten-grade 8 to avoid confusion.

MOTION AND VOTE: It was moved by Mrs. Miller, seconded by Dr. Dominguez, and carried unanimously to recommend that the State Board of Education approve for first reading and filing authorization proposed repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 111, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §§111.11-111.17, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §§111.21-111.24, and proposed amendments to 19 TAC Chapter 111, <u>Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Mathematics</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Elementary</u>, §111.1, and Subchapter B, <u>Middle School</u>, §§111.25.

Gene Lenz, director, division of federal and state education policy, explained that the agency convened a stakeholder meeting to discuss possible changes to 19 TAC Chapter 89, <u>Adaptations for Special Populations</u>, Subchapter D, <u>Special Education Services and Settings</u>, §89.63, <u>Instructional Arrangements and Settings</u>, and that the proposal reflects feedback from the stakeholders.

MOTION: It was moved by Dr. Dominguez and seconded by Ms. Perez to recommend that the State Board of Education, approve for first reading and filing authorization proposed amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 89, <u>Adaptations for Special Populations</u>, Subchapter D, <u>Special Education</u> <u>Services and Settings</u>, §89.63, <u>Instructional Arrangements and Settings</u>.

MOTION AND VOTE: It was moved by Mrs. Miller, seconded by Mrs. Melton-Malone, and carried unanimously to recommend that the State Board of Education amend §89.63(b) to read as follows:

(b) Subject to <u>§89.1075(e)</u> of this title (relating to General Program Requirements and Local District Procedures) for the purpose of determining the student's instructional arrangement/setting, the regular school day is defined as the period of time determined appropriate by the admission, review, and dismissal (ARD) committee.

and amend §89.63 (c)(7) and (c)(7)(B) to read as follows:

- (7) <u>Off-home [Off home]</u> campus. This instructional arrangement/setting is for providing special education and related services to the following, including, <u>but not limited to</u>, students at South Texas Independent School District and Windham Independent School District:
 - (B) a student in a community setting or environment (not operated by a school district) that prepares the student for postsecondary education/training, integrated employment, and/or independent living in coordination with the student's individual transition goals and objectives, including a student with regularly scheduled instruction or direct involvement provided by school district personnel, or a student in a facility not operated by a school district (other than a nonpublic day school) with instruction provided by school district personnel [whose instruction is provided by school district personnel in a facility not operated by a school district]; or

<u>VOTE:</u> A vote was taken on the motion to approve for first reading and filing authorization proposed amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 89, <u>Adaptations for Special Populations</u>, Subchapter D, <u>Special Education Services and Settings</u>, §89.63, <u>Instructional Arrangements and Settings</u> as amended. The motion carried unanimously.
