Deaf and Hard of Hearing Certification Test Exemption Application

Texas law allows individuals who are hearing impaired, according to the definition below, to be issued a Temporary Exemption Certificate, enabling them to serve as a teacher without passing certain written tests for educator certification (Texas Education Code, Sections 21.048[b-d]).

An individual who meets **both** of the following requirements is eligible to obtain the Temporary Exemption Certificate:

A. Meets the definition of hearing impaired by having a "a hearing impairment so severe that the person cannot process linguistic information with or without amplification." (TEC §21.048[d][1]);

And

B. Satisfies all requirements for certification other than successful completion of the required certification exams. (Note: If successful completion of the TExES ASL test, TASC, and/or TASC-ASL is required, the individual—even if hearing impaired—must pass the test(s).)
